We measure what matters: steady progress, wellbeing, and successful transitions. Here are key highlights

- Reading growth: Average +1.8 years for students who started below grade level.
- Math progress: 76% met or exceeded year-end benchmarks.
- Attendance: 92% overall with targeted follow-up for at-risk learners.
- Wellbeing: 0 incidents of corporal punishment; issues resolved through restorative steps.
- Transitions: 85% of Grade 8 students placed in partner high schools or scholarships.
- Writing proficiency: 72% met or exceeded the grade-level rubric by year-end.
- Science projects: 140 inquiry projects completed across Grades 3–8.
- Digital skills: 90% of students type 20+ wpm by Grade 6.
- Reading culture: 4,800 library checkouts this year (≈2 books per student per month).
- Safety readiness: 100% staff safeguarding-certified; 3 emergency drills per term.
- Expanding Access to the Arts and Cultural Expression Across All Grade Levels: 88% of students performed or exhibited work at least once this year.
- Strengthening Health, Hygiene, and Daily Routines for Consistent Learning Readiness: Morning health checks reduced late arrivals by 23% over two terms.
- Building Emotional Resilience Through Counseling, Mentoring, and Peer Support Circles: 71% of referred students met personal goals within 12 weeks.
- Growing Family–School Partnerships With Workshops, Home Visits, and Progress Meetings: 210 guardians attended at least one workshop; average satisfaction 4.6/5.
- Investing in Teacher Development With Coaching, Lesson Study, and Classroom Observation: Staff completed 420+ training hours; 96% implementation rate for new strategies.
